DRAGISA SLIJEPCEVIC *EDITOR-IN-CHIEF OF THE BULLETIN OF JURISPRUDENCE OF THE SUPREME COURT OF SERBIA*

The Bulletin of Jurisprudence of the Supreme Court of Serbia is the bestselling professional journal in Serbia, says proudly Dragisa Slijepcevic, the Editor-in-chief of the Bulletin and the President of the Chamber of Commercial Disputes of the Supreme Court's Civil Department.

- This is a professional journal which publishes legal views and opinions of all departments and the legal opinion of the General Session of the Supreme Court. It publishes also excerpts from decisions which are of particular importance for jurisprudence, with the aim to inform all those who hold judicial functions about the accepted opinions, which then indicate the defined legal direction for resolving cases, so that identical cases are treated in an identical manner.

In the section "Reviews" the judges of the Supreme Court, professors and eminent legal experts present new laws, indicate new solutions, so that all those who hold a judicial function are timely informed about these regulations.

The section "Surveys" presents judges' reports on significant controversial issues in jurisprudence. We also have an occasional section "Library" with essays written by our esteemed legal experts on topical issues in the field of civil, administration and criminal law, and this is at the same time a way to enrich the Supreme Court's library because they contribute their books – says judge Slijepcevic.

The Bulletin is a quarterly published in three thousand copies; it has three regular issues and one thematic issue which publishes all papers from the traditional annual conference of judges from throughout Serbia in Vrnjacka Banja, "Judges' Days". The Bulletin is available not only to judges, but also to all those interested; those who buy it are law schools, lawyers, legal experts in business and the administration, and the publisher, Intermeks, was assigned upon public competition.

- All the copies are always sold out, and the Bulletin is available by a popular price. Annual subscription for all four issues is 1,800 dinars, and individual copies cost 400 dinars for regular issues and 600 dinars for the thematic one. No issue has less than 200 pages.

What is published in the Bulletin cannot be read anywhere else, because we protect the intellectual property of the authors – says Dragisa Slijepcevic.

He stresses that the main aim of the Bulletin is to standardize the courts' practice, as well as to educate the young judges.
